Swedish Prime Minister congratulates the new President in India

Smt. Droupadi Murmu has taken over as the 15th President of India. Many international leaders congratulated the new President of India, including the outgoing Swedish Prime Minister Ms. Magdalena Andersson. She tweeted to congratulate and stated that Ms. Murmu is the "first member of the tribal community and the second woman" to hold the high office in India. The Swedish leader stated that India and Sweden are having strong partnership in the areas of 'health, innovation and sustainability'.

MoU on financial cooperation between India and Sweden

Sweden's financial supervisory authority, Finansinspektionen (FI) and its Indian counterpart, the International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to bolster mutual cooperation. Signed in the presence of the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the move marks a significant leap between the two partners and is expected to notably improve bilateral financial cooperation. The MoU will enable a framework for mutual assistance and facilitation



of exchange of information between the two agencies on the development, regulation and enforcing compliance of laws in the respective countries.

Besides, the focus was also on how to advance India-Sweden cooperation in the field of innovation, technology and sustainable environment. Critical areas of cooperation such as research and innovation, renewable energy,

sustainability, clean technology and health, solar alliance and cooperation in areas such as digital infrastructure were discussed in length

India appoints 1st woman head for its top scientific body

Senior scientist Dr. Nallathamby Kalaiselvi has been appointed as the Director General of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR). She becomes the first woman to head the CSIR, which spearheads a consortium of 38 research institutes across India. Dr. Kalaiselvi is known for her work in the field of lithium-ion batteries.

INTERNATIONAL UPDATES

India's updated climate targets

On August 3, the Indian Union Cabinet approved India's updated Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) under the Paris Agreement to be conveyed to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). In a press release, the revised NDC incorporated two new pledges made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the 26th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP26) to the UNFCCC held in Glasgow, United Kingdom. These include reducing emissions intensity of its GDP by 45 per cent by 2030, from 2005 level and achieving about 50 per cent cumulative electric power installed capacity from non-fossil fuel-based energy resources by 2030.

India's critical role in I2U2 and Quad frameworks

Jake Sullivan, the National Security Advisor of the United States, stressed on India's "critical role in the Indo-Pacific" as one of the "most significant, most strategically consequential countries in the Indo-Pacific." His remarks were in response to questions on the reason behind including India into groupings like the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework, the Quad and I2U2. According to Sullivan, India plays a "central role in US strategy, including through the Quad" and that its relations with the Middle East and Gulf countries must be harnessed in the I2U2 summit.

India supplies food grains to Afghanistan

India has sent the 15th consignment of 2,500 MT of wheat as food aid to Afghanistan as humanitarian assistance via the Attari-Wagah border. So far, 36,000 MTs of wheat have been sent by the Food Corporation of India (FCI) to Afghanistan to date. India will send another 14,000 MT of wheat to the crisis-hit country soon as New Delhi had promised to send a total of 50,000 MT of wheat to Afghanistan. The first consignment of humanitarian aid of 2,500 tonnes of wheat from India reached Afghanistan's Jalalabad through Pakistan on February 26.
